Some households produce more waste than can be collected in one refuse container and the cost of additional collections is spread across the city through council tax.

The council collects kerbside recycling using the box and bag system, and collection crews sort the materials at the kerbside. This collection method is expensive and is not suitable for all properties in the city, therefore many households, mainly flats, do not have a recycling collection at their kerbside. The alternative collection method, "co-mingling", uses one container (often a wheeled bin) for all recyclable material, which can then be sorted at a Material Recycling Facility. This makes collections more efficient and could be provided to flats with on-street or communal bins. If this system were adopted, a sorting facility would need to be developed and households with the box and bag system would be issued with a new wheeled bin to replace the existing black box and white bag.

PLAY AREAS

Since the introduction of British and European Safety Standards, children's play areas and specifically equipped play spaces across the city have been improved to provide safer play opportunities. These improvements have included safer surfacing, the introduction of multi play units, accommodating greater numbers of children, and the introduction of items suitable for older children. However, anecdotal evidence suggests that play areas are now not being used as much as they perhaps could be. We're told that children do not find them interesting or adventurous enough, and as a result, play parks are under used.

Our experience is that requests have increased for larger structures and particularly those with moving components, for example aerial runways, large section tyre (cantilever) swings, and larger enclosed slides etc.

Aberdeen City Council currently maintains 159 play parks within the city. We want to find out what you think about these play areas and in particular how safe they are. This will help us assess the city's play areas and potentially change the type of provision.
