COMMUNITY JUSTICE

Crime in Aberdeen fell by 43% between 2006 and 2015 — in 2014-15 alone it fell by 10%! - and, with the help of communities, we would like to work to reduce offending even further. A new model for Community Justice will come into effect from 1st April 2017. It is intended to increase communities' awareness and understanding of community justice and promote participation in the planning, delivery and evaluation of community justice services and policy.

To start this process we would welcome your responses and suggestions to the questions set out below.

Community Justice is described as "the collection of individuals, agencies and services that work together to support, manage and supervise people who have committed offences, from the point of arrest, through prosecution, community disposal or custody and alternatives to these. Local communities and the third sector are a vital part of this process which aims to prevent and reduce further offending and the harm that it causes".

COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDERS (CPOS)

Community Payback Orders (previously Probation and Community Service) are imposed by the courts and are intended to enable people who have committed offences to 'payback' to communities: firstly by requiring an offender to make reparation, often in the form of Unpaid Work; and secondly by requiring them to address and change their offending behaviour.

During 2015-16 a total of 1,132 Community Payback Orders were imposed on offenders in Aberdeen, 90% of which included an Unpaid Work Requirement. Approximately 80,000 hours of unpaid work were carried out on a wide range of individual placements and work parties. Work included helping with the revitalisation of the St Nicholas Centre rooftop seating area, and maintaining parks and green spaces.
