




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BEING INFORMED: Local Consultation

Consultation is an important tool used by councils such as Aberdeen City for assessing the views of the local population and engaging the local people in the policy making process. Recent innovations in computer and Internet technologies have meant that electronic consultations such as online forums and questionnaires are now possible. While electronic consultations can never wholly replace traditional forms of consultations such as meetings, it is important to investigate the potential benefits of these new technologies for improving the local consultation process.

These questions are being asked to find out your experiences of participating in local consultations (both 'traditional' and online) and whether or not you would be willing to engage in online consultations. The results will feed into a report that will be presented to Aberdeen City Council to help develop an effective consultation strategy that will allow for the maximum number of local people to participate and contribute their views to the policy making process.

Public Performance Reporting

There is a legal duty on all Local Government organisations to report publicly on how they are performing. This is called Public Performance Reporting. Grampian Police are already required to report on statutory performance. The Local Government in Scotland Act, passed in 2003, however, requires Grampian Police Force to go one step further and make local information available to local people. To do this, we need to know what information our local communities want, when they want it, and in what format. Consultation on Major Planning Issues

The Council wants to know how well we communicate on important and contentious town and country planning matters. Town and country planning is the means by which local councils manage the development and use of land. We do this using:

- A Structure Plan to set out the overall land use framework for North East Scotland;
- A Local Plan to allocate specific sites in Aberdeen to particular uses;
- Master Plans for important or contentious development areas that are larger than a single site;
- Planning Briefs to give detailed guidance about the layout and type of development acceptable on a particular site; and
- Planning applications to decide individual development proposals.

These questions are concerned with how we can provide more information and how we can consult better on major planning matters. There is a procedure firmly laid down by law on how we deal with planning applications, so we are not asking about these here.
