The Scottish Government will expand the offer of funded Early Learning and Childcare from 600 hours to 1140 hours per annum for eligible two year olds* and all three and four year olds, whose parents want such a service, by 2020.

*Eligible two year olds are children who are 'Looked After', subject to a 'Kinship Care Order' or 'Parent Appointed Guardianship' or whose families are in receipt of certain benefits.

- Flexibility
- Affordability
- Accessibility

Winter Maintenance Policy

1 Do you think the council is making adequate provision?

The Council's Winter Maintenance Policy for its Adopted Road Network is intended to reduce as far as practicable the effects of adverse weather conditions on the movement of people and goods. The aim is to permit safe travel on the roads that serve bus routes and through traffic. Each year the Council has to set aside a considerable sum from its limited roads maintenance budget in order to be prepared for whatever winter may throw at us. The council currently spends between $\mathfrak{L}1.5M$ and $\mathfrak{L}3M$ on winter maintenance of its roads. Equipment (gritters, ploughs and salt) has to be available in case they are required and staff has to be granted stand-by allowances in their pay in case they need to turn out.

With regard to the run of mild winters we have been experiencing of late an argument can be made to reduce the current level of preparedness and thus the budget allocation. This would, in principle, make more funding available for jobs such as gulley cleaning and pot hole fixing. The risk would be that we would have more difficulty providing an adequate service in the event of a particular harsh winter.
