
# LATEST ON THE LOIP

# Outcome Improvement Groups

#### **HOUSING FIRST**

We are seeing early evidence of success as a result of changes we are testing to improve our rehousing process for people leaving prison. The average homeless journey is currently 22.9 weeks and we aim to reduce this to 6 weeks for people leaving prison.




#### FREE SCHOOL MEALS

After a successful small-scale pilot in the Northfield Locality in 2017 we aim to increase provision of <u>free school meals</u> during school holidays to children by delivering 10,000 meals to children across Aberdeen during 2018/19.



#### SCHOOL GARDEN TIME


Our school garden improvement project is resulting in children in our localities benefitting from garden time. This supports early intervention by teaching children about food growing, healthy food choices and social responsibility. Learning outdoors offers exciting opportunities for pupils.



# Locality Partnerships

## LIVING STREETS

Following the success of the living streets improvement project to reduce dog fouling in Torry, the project is being scaled up and spread to other communities across Aberdeen with the help of £10k in funding from Aberdeen City Council.



## VICTORIART PROJECT

Regeneration of Victoria Road is a key driver in the Locality Plan. There have been three new pieces of public artwork created in March and April this year at Walker Road Primary, Victoria Road and at Torry Youth and Leisure Centre.



## **HAYTON ROAD SAFETY**

Speeding and Road safety was highlighted by Tillydrone residents as a priority issue. The project is testing changes to reduce the incidents of <u>speeding and related</u> <u>traffic safety issues</u> on Hayton Road by 40% by August 18.
