She highlighted how impressed she was that there were so many members attending and participating in the Partnership.</p> <p>Cllr Laing commended the Partnership on its achievements to date and the Annual report highlights how much work has been done. She mentioned that the refresh of the LOIP and the Population needs assessment are almost complete – They will be presented to the commissioning committee next Tuesday along with Locality Annual Reports.</p> <p>Cllr laing encouraged the Locality Partnership to seek support from herself and the Board for any future challenges.</p> <p>No questions</p>

The project wants to increase engagement with Women and families. It will also be promoted and distributed through Balnagask Community Centre and Tullos Learning Centre</p>

<p>9. <u>Report Back from Torry Partnership</u> <u>TYAG</u> –Update covered by Improvement charter updates <u>Partnership Forum by Neil</u> Originally put in place from ASG groups. Kincorth and Torry now linked together. Did have improvement plan with funding given for those in school with additional needs. Now trying to re-focus and give extra capacity. Introduced bounce back programme – teachers trained in Primary’s. Identifying priorities and action plan together with Torry LP. <u>LLG by Shamini</u> Have recently defined 5 priority areas. 1) Impact of universal credits and impact on health and wellbeing being seen. 2) Improving HW through healthy food choices 3) MH & using holistic methods 4) Increase social inclusion. 5) Reduce alcohol impact Developing project team leads and members. Try to include community reps. Looking at how mental health services are re-designed in Torry <u>HSCP by Shamini</u> Strategic plan up for review and development. <p>10. <u>Torry Community Hub- Jo</u> The bid has is being submitted to round 2 RGCF funding from gov. £2 million –deadline Monday. Colin met with com reps to look at local engagement around Hub development and to seek comments on draft bid</p>	

<p>11. <u>Cryff Court Update- Jo</u> £50,000 Commitment from Cryff in addition to £250,000 from ACC. Preferred site is Tullos playing fields. Currently going through ACC governance for approval.</p>	
<p>12. <u>Former Phoenix- Anne-Marie</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Work commenced by Kings Foundation contractor to look at essential external and internal design working alongside Robertson's. Funds from Section 75. Robertson's completion date should be in next couple of weeks. 2) Roof works should be complete. Gas metre will need replaced and is being dealt with. 3) Kings Foundation hoping to have draft architect drawings by end of next week and will be contacting building Standard team to establish warrants required. This is for additional section 75 funds and Cllr Allan funding for internals. 4) Lease and Management agreement currently sitting with Council Legal team.
