<p>Introduction of a Single Point of Contact across Multi Agency Partnership partner agencies to improve pathways to support.</p> <p>A new data collection system which will allow us to identify those children most in need (identified through traffic light system)</p> <p>As of the End of September 2020, baseline data does not yet exist for “% of care experience young people receiving educational input” around alcohol and drugs.</p> <p>Project Manager/Lead officer for Substance use in Child & Family SW is currently engaged in process of generating baseline data through identifying a sample of Looked After Children (expanding focus beyond those Looked after who are ‘care experienced’, to any LAC, given the vulnerabilities of this at-risk population) and doing a case audit to identify any levels of prevention based work (including educational input) which is being provided.</p> <p>This sample will be identified through LAC who are being affected by parental substance misuse given the known links between this and young people’s own use of substances.</p>	<p>The Lead officer for Substance use within Child and Family SW - this post started during COVID 19 restrictions and has used this time to establish benchmarks, identify most appropriate data and develop plans</p>
