	ADA also ran a campaign offering online Naloxone training, analytics available, interestingly that week shows the highest number of kits supplied this year We have increased Naloxone supplies available through ACC housing support 14 staff members trained, third sector housing support organisation, 14 staff members trained and are progressing this with local Peer support org, third sector orgs and Kittybrewster custody suite. Whilst some of these changes have been paused we have progressed with the development of an outreach team to respond to high risk individuals and Scottis Ambulance Service information on people who have experienced a non-fatal overdose. Information sharing agreement is the final step in progressing this and are hopeful this will be in place shortly
