

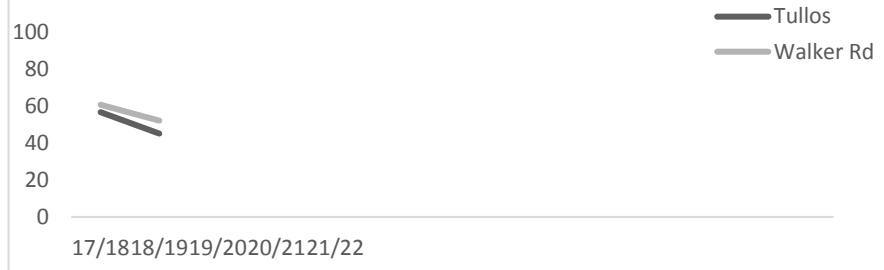

Changes Being Tested (Specify location/ test group) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Redesign of Pantry access to ensure social distancing and maintaining safety within Covid 19 environment. • Establishing a booking system and rota to ensure fairness for all Pantry members. • Working with Social Security Scotland to identify members in Torry entitled to Best Start Vouchers who are still not claiming. 	Are our changes resulting in improvement? <p>With the Covid 19 lockdown CFINE’s pantries in Poynerook and at Woodside closed. At that point there were 60 members of the BS&S Pantry. Pantries remained closed until mid-September but are starting to re-open now tentatively on a slot booking basis - CFINE trialled last week; BS&SP opening on 24th September and Woodside due to open from 6th October. The combined membership of Pantries in the city was 464 at the point of lockdown in March, with an estimated total number of 800-900 beneficiaries.</p> <p>Covid 19 has led to a huge increase in people requesting emergency food support. Pre-Covid, CFINE alone was providing approx. 100 food parcels a day. CFINE closed its food bank on lockdown and has been providing a contactless home delivery service with the demand for emergency food support rising to 300 a day (many of these are pantry members). With the current recession rise in redundancies alongside an inadequate benefit system food insecurity will rise and the need for community pantries as an alternative to food banks will increase.</p>
