3.	Update from Community Planning Aberdeen	Allison S
	Allison Swanson gave a presentation from Community Planning Aberdeen which covered the LOIP refresh, Locality Plans, continuing projects, new projects, the development plan and next steps. The presentation is attached to the email with the minutes.	

There was a query on when the CPA website would be updated with new charters and information as this will soon be out of date. Allison confirmed that this would be updated following the CPA Board meeting on Wed 7<sup>th</sup> July.

A comment was made on how we can get communities more involved, when there is little money to do stuff and that people need to volunteer their time. Staff are concentrated on priority localities and that the wider neighbourhoods this is done through volunteers. We need to have a simplified way to get communities on board and for people to think they are part of the full process. It was confirmed that there will be easy read versions of the LOIP and locality plans to help with this.

Query on Model for Improvement bootcamps and if these are just for new project leads or if others could join e.g. project leads to refresh memory. It was confirmed that anyone can join the training bootcamps and are encouraged to do so.

There was a query on if we can do more to point people from oil and gas to energy transition.

There are a number of government funding streams and initiatives available to help with reskilling between industry but that there still aren't the jobs available, we are constrained with what we can do until the jobs come.

There is a parallel project around the Energy Transition Zone, working with universities on the skills transition.

Scottish Government £15 million skills plan, which members of Aberdeen Prospers are working on, will support upskilling / reskilling as well as entrepreneurship.

Martin suggested that he could bring some of the Regional Economic Strategy strands to Aberdeen Prospers to update the group and would discuss this with Allison and Duncan. Martin / Allison C / Duncan
