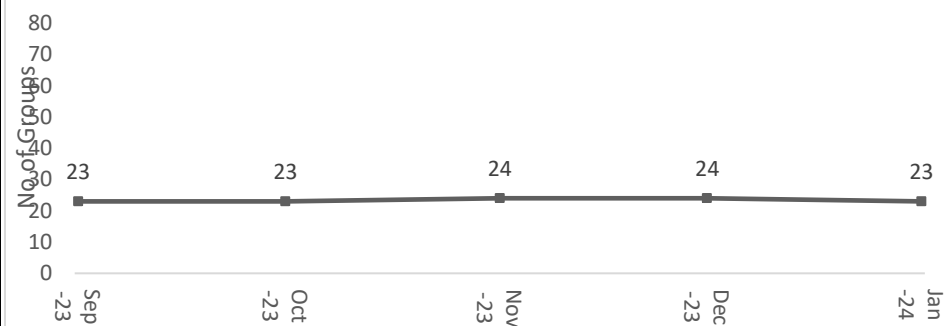

Those who attended found it useful and plan to come to the next one in February. An EAL Peep group began on Jan 15th. This is being delivered by the Greynhope nursery staff and a member of the EAL team. A poster and video link was shared widely to staff and managers about the benefits of delivering Peep. As a result, we've had some managers approach the team about Peep delivery. Peep received money from the Child Healthy Weights group to train 10 more practitioners and to buy resources to support the delivery of Healthier Families Peep programme.

- <i>There is the issue of quality assurance- if Peep grows too big too quickly, we're at risk of losing some of the quality the programme has prided itself as delivering over the past 20 years. Invites to take part in QA visits have been made and some dates have been scheduled.</i> - <i>There is potential of lack of capacity to support newly trained practitioners and those who haven't started delivering yet due to the small Peep team. – This first practitioner networking event has taken place, Peep Coordinator has been</i>			In the spring of 2023, Peep sent out an annual survey to the programme and had 90 families reply. One of the questions was "Is there anything that could make it [Peep] better?" and of those who answered that question, 56% of the responses requested more Peep groups across the city and longer sessions. Families are also asked regularly at Peep sessions and on Facebook to share what they want from the programme.
