In response to that: Margaret mentioned that through the libraries they are thinking of setting up a digital inclusion group and would be happy to hear from others about anything that they might be able to contribute to that. 	
			 Community spaces – Elaine did some work last year about cost of living, and it was found that access to community spaces was becoming a barrier and we have been asked to take that paper to the NE Population Health Alliance and Michelle is on the steering group, and so we have been asked to take that through that group too – noting a common theme. Jade noted that in the locality plans digital inclusion comes through strongly and raised that generally we should be trying to make things as digitally accessible as possible. Maggie raised that ACVO have a community spaces page on our website. Maggie asked for any other points to be shared back to her for collating as part of the minutes. 	All
	Digital Inclusion findings so far – Presentation from Martin	MW	 Martin delivered his presentation which was well received and posed the questions: How should the CPA proceed? Development of a CPA strategy? Add a section to Community Empowerment Strategy? Do nothing? Or Something else? 	

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			 Questions from the group: Dave asked about the City Voice feedback and asked if it was a generational or poverty issue? Anne went through some of the figures from the last City Voice report to clarify. Dave suggested a one page of principles as an appendix to the CE strategy. Elaine spoke about the cost of living work being done by her team last year and the cost of broadband for young people came up and how with difficult choices being made this was lower in priorities. Margaret let the group know that the library service has seen an uptake in PC use, and an increase in people coming in with their own devices to access the wi-fi. In relation to the digital strategy Margaret suggested looking at the national digital strategy – A Changing Nation. Suggests that there may be some things that we can refer to nationally. Margaret agreed with the idea of a set of principles. Martin found doing the research very interesting and sometimes surprising and would value a coherent view of how many people are excluded in the City, where are they and whare can we signpost them to the best information that might help them become more included. Martin suggests an additional page to the existing strategy. Susan would like to have information of social tariffs for groups of organisations she works with, and suggests it should be readily available possibly on the cost of living webpage on the council website. Martin offered to send this round, Colin included a reference to this in the chat. A page to be added to the Community Empowerment Strategy in the future.
