Police Scotland	Jade and her team met with police Scotland who are looking to have a more active and continuous role in in their priority partnerships area. It was suggested that a Sergeant be at each one where possible. Tillydrone - 182 calls received to the police which is a slight increase. Seaton links field - 224 calls received to the police which is an increase. Hilton - 155 calls to police in the month of April, which is a slight decrease. LOIP	JL - Not much to update on the Locality Plans as the refreshed LOIP and LP's were approved last Monday - the 29th of April. JL has shared concerns with website designers for discussion as it was discussed around the table that the website could still be more community / user friendly. DB - Offered to collate any feedback re the website. Any comments can be fed into Dave in lieu of attending a session that Dave will organise and send out details of session.		
WOODSIDE DECIDES	Opening of the Woodside Fountain - https://youtu.be/cCqfXli6ob4 DB - The Partnership is an opportunity for community members and groups/organisations working in any of the three areas to come together with the aim of improving the local areas. Dave Black shmu gave an overview of the Woodside Decides initiative, being taken forward by the Woodside Network. £18,000 has been secured for Woodside community members to come together and decide how to improve the area. Through surveys and focus groups, community members identified that what they value the most about Woodside is the friendliness and welcoming nature of the community. In terms of priorities for improvement, community members want to see improvements to green space in the area,		

	including increased play facilities within parks. At the end of March people came together to decide who to spend the first £8,000 on improving the environment, as well as mental health and wellbeing. As a result of this event there will be a series of new activities and services available in Woodside - more news to follow soon! Justine Dunbar from SAMH spoke about her role as part of the North East Suicide Prevention Team, with a significant focus on tackling stigma. The team are looking to create the conditions that mean people feel more comfortable to speak about suicide and related issues. There definitely seems to be more people talking about wellbeing and mental health, but there's still it's still a big stigma around suicide. Justine spoke about the introduction to suicide prevention training - as part of the Grampian Wellbeing Festival (there are still some spaces left for online training). There was a group discussion on potential sessions aimed at community members. Justine is keen to promote the Prevent suicide prevention app for the North East. It was also noted that there's a series of well-being events taking place across the Grampian region. An update was provided on the plan for the Central area, which includes Tillydrone, Woodside and Seaton - the plan has now been approved, and can be found here.
