Children who attended were fully engaged with different activities, with plenty networking opportunities for adults and partners. Big Noise did a brilliant performance. Pictures of shelter shared, seating to be added in the near future, with lots more great and interesting ideas and plans. There are notes of interest for using the space for different activities. Scoop the dog came along to peak interest in dog fouling and how the council can engage with dog owners to be more responsible in the area. Mr and Mrs Linnick from Dooney's Farm came to open the event.	
6. RAAC Iain Robertson – HSCP are organising all colleagues in Aberdeen City Council and Penumbra, the mental health and well-being drop in session for people in Tory affected by RAC. Tuesday 25th in the bridge centre. JM – A presentation was given to communities, housing and Public Protection Committee. We've met with the Torry Community Council, tenant and resident forum. There will be support for people in terms of being rehomed and moving. The council will arrange for moving of household items, floor coverings, etc. environment and the safety. So that is something that's that's come up. The increase in void properties has been raised – housing have engaged with the Community Safety Partnership and the local policing team. The Community City wardens will increase the patrols and a crime reduction survey has been undertaken with Police Scotland. The council are working the Environmental services team in terms of ensuring that bins are easily identified to prevent fly tipping.	

JO –

There are roughly 372 individual buildings affected and all that the Council has 366 and there's 138 private, of which 27 are private landlords. All properties are high risk. The Council doesn't have any obligation for private owners.
