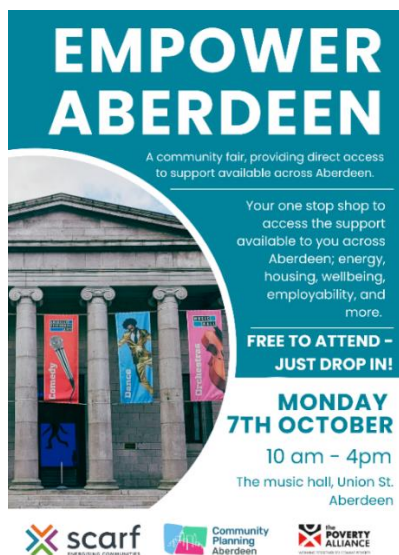

Tackling Financial Disadvantage in Migrant Households



Grampian Regional Equalities Council (GREC) will launch their report about their ongoing work to explore effective solutions and end cycles of poverty and inequality.

The report presents evidence that migrant households face considerable financial disadvantages and barriers to overcoming these which are insufficiently seen or

understood in anti-poverty policy measures and interventions. While a great many services and support organisations are working exceptionally hard to support service users, including migrants, the current landscape of provision is not working well to meet migrants' needs.
